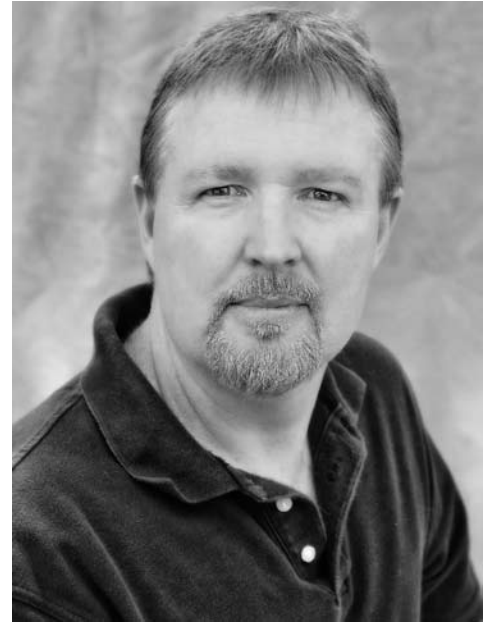

SEARCHING FOR JOHNNIE LONG

Johnnie R. Long of Clay County, Texas, graduated from the 8th class at the ASTC in late July 1945, but the war ended while en route to his first mission as a member of the Grimes Team. Long writes in a 1946 letter to Mrs. A.M. Thompson, "The war ended while en route on first mission. I would have liked very much to have gone on at least one mission". Afterwards, he performed a beach reconnaissance mission in Wakayama, Japan with Henry L. Adkins team and served with a group of Alamo Scouts as the occupation force in Kyoto. In November of 1945, Johnnie went home and was never heard from again by his teammates.

For the past few years now Johnnie Long's name has come up. I searched the internet constantly, but always came up dry. One day I found a letter that he had written along with a cool photo of himself leaning against a tree holding a Thompson machine gun. I needed to find this guy. I called teammates Henry Adkins and Carl Bertoch for help. Carl said that Johnnie was a quiet fellow and that they had lost contact with him after the war. Henry said that on one occasion in the early 1950s he was out of town and saw a newspaper photo of Johnnie guarding a foxhole in Korea. This motivated me even more. I went back and compared the letter with the official ASA roster. There it was. His name was listed as "Johnny," the more common spelling. No wonder I could not find him. While working on the new book that Lance and I are doing, I did another internet search, this time with the correct spelling. There he was, plain as day. I sunk in my chair in front of the computer. It read, "Johnnie R. Long was Killed in Action on August 16th, 1950 in Korea." For days I walked around feeling like I had just lost a close friend. It was quite a letdown after all this time to learn what became of Johnnie. But it doesn't end there. Now I find myself searching for family members, with a little luck I won't have to worry about the spelling.

Korea & Vietnam - Alfonso, Hall, LaChaussee, Rounsaville, Smith, and Wolff.

*Alfonso also earned the Combat Infantryman's Badge three times. A rare feat indeed!

*Tom Rounsaville was the ground forces commander during the liberation of Europeans from Congolese rebels in Africa in 1965.

*Kittleson was called to duty in Little Rock, Arkansas in 1957 during the integration of Little Rock Central High School, and also was one of the raiders at Son Tay POW camp outside Hanoi in 1970.

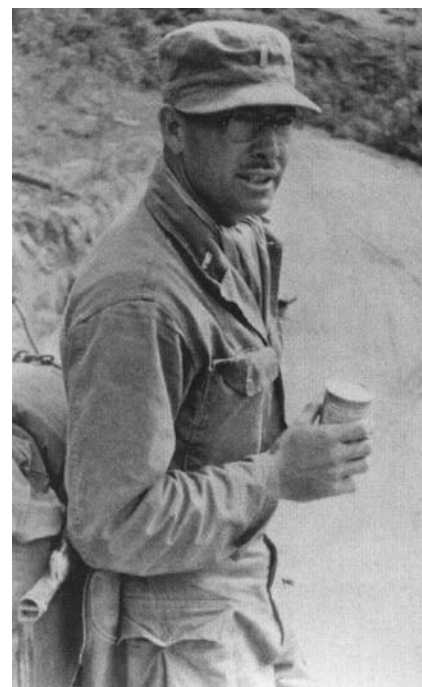

Littlefield & Lutz Teams on USS Wachapreague



One of the most reliable ways of finding information on the location of the Alamo Scouts during a specific time is consulting U.S. Navy deck logs. The Navy was meticulous about recording who came aboard and departed their ships, and at what times. It seems that the bigger the boat (aircraft carriers, battleships, destroyers, cruisers, LSTs, etc.) the better the record keeping. The smaller the boat (especially PT boats) the less detailed the comings and goings were reported—if at all.

The photo (left) was obtained from the deck log of the USS Wachapreague, a PT tender that was home to Alamo Scouts teams en route to Leyte from New Guinea. Nellist, Rounsaville, Dove, and Littlefield Teams, along with other operational scout teams were aboard the Wachapreague when it left PT Base 17 at Woendi Island on 13 October and arrived off Leyte on 20 October, the day of the major landing there.

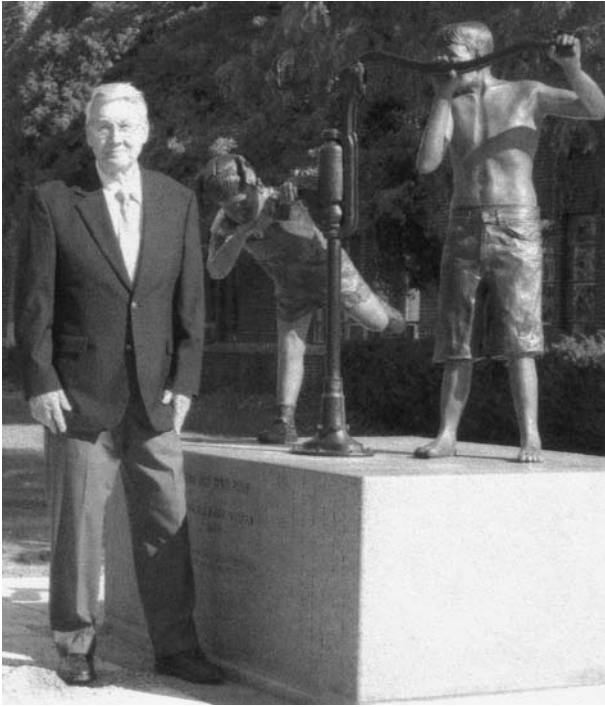


The log entry, dated 22 October 1944, states that Alamo Scouts William B. Lutz, John McGowen, Wilbur Littlefield, Samuel Armstrong, Alva Branson, Zeke McConnell, Elmer Niemela, Oliver Roesler, Bob Ross, Bob Shullaw, Allen Throgmorton, and William Watson were transferred to shore between noon and 4 p.m. The next day Littlefield Team was off on a mission to Tanauan. What is not stated is that on the night of 22 October Nellist Team left the tender on a secret mission to Mindanao. Leave it to an Alamo Scout to slip out undetected!

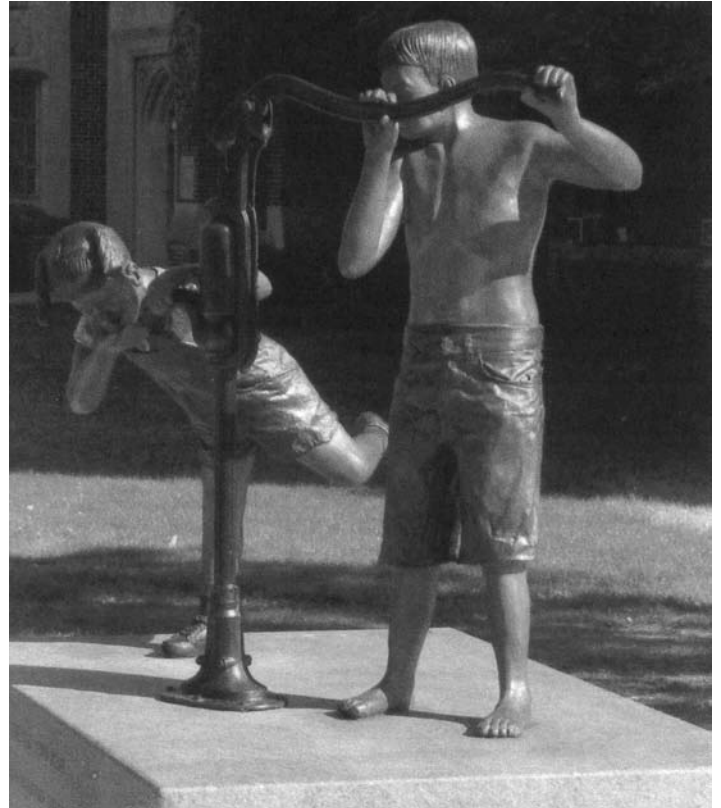
In the News...

LANDMARK SCENE IN PERRYSBURG REVIVED IN BRONZE

This fall World War II PT boat veteran and ASA member Ralph Kleeberger completed a life-size bronze sculpture, "The Town Pump", and donated it to his hometown of Perrysburg, Ohio. The inspiration for Ralph's nine-year project was the town's old water pump that was scrapped in the 1940s for the war effort. The sculpture is on display at the Perrysburg schools' Commodore Building two blocks from the site of the original pump. "It was a center of interest," recalled Ralph. "I wanted it to be where it could be seen."
